

USDA-NRCS Accepting Applications for Gulf Coast Conservation Reserve Program (GCCRP)

Gulf Coast Conservation Reserve Program (GCCRP) (Planning & Implementation) - Mississippi



Jackson, Miss. –The United States Department of Agriculture/Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is soliciting landowners that are interested in habitat restoration through the Gulf Coast Conservation Reserve Program (GCCRP).

GCCRP is a Category 1 project on the RESTORE Act funded Priorities List and will be established on approximately 9,000 acres across the Southeast for the purpose of protecting and restoring critical wildlife habitat. In Mississippi, 2,000 acres of restoration will take place in **George**, **Jackson**, **Hancock**, **Harrison**, **Pearl River**, **and Stone** counties.

The primary objective of GCCRP is to improve habitat conditions through the development and implementation of conservation plans and practices. The practices will contribute to the restoration and protection of the natural resources and wildlife habitats of Gulf Coast ecosystems. These ecosystems provide habitat for numerous threatened and endangered plant and animal species.

To qualify for this program, an applicant must have legal possession of the land. NRCS will be contracting vendors with technical expertise to execute conservation projects.

Applications for all NRCS assistance programs are accepted on a continuous basis with specific sign-up deadlines being established to rank, contract and fund qualified tracts of land. NRCS reserves the right to setup a GCCRP application ranking deadline, if needed. Applicants can sign up for GCCRP at their local NRCS office.
